A WORD FROM THE PASTOR

This week I would like to address two subjects that is weighing heavily on my mind: "Impatience and understanding."

- 1. The word Impatient means: "having or showing a tendency to be quickly irritated or provoked"

 "Restlessly eager: 'they are impatient for change...'"
- 2. "Understand[ing]: "to be sympathetically or knowledgeably aware of the character or nature of..."

Changes under certain circumstances are something we all can agree is a necessary thing if a person or a community of persons is to grow and deepen their faith. After all, isn't it our goal to deepen one's faith, to understand and to be patient in receiving that faith?

Letting our faith stagnate (or anything really) does not help us or others. Being impatient only causes hurt and pain to others in our community. In the church, we have many examples to follow: Mary, the Mother of God and Jesus Himself have demonstrated time and time again their patience, love and understanding of others and what others might be experiencing in their lives.

Sometimes, I wonder, if the person who is impatient might be experiencing a crisis in their life which might manifest itself in a negative way, e.g. a loved one has been diagnosed with an illness or the person complaining might have something that is impacting them. I don't know. For these reasons, I attempt to be patient and to understand the thing an individual is experiencing at that moment.

"Patience is the living heart of ethics". "Patience is the calm acceptance that things can happen in a different order than the one you have in mind." Patience is a neglected virtue. We do not appreciate patience as much as courage, or generosity because it requires that we restraint ourselves."—Mc Mullin

And by restraining ourselves in this way it allows us to understand the other person and what he or she may be experiencing.

Henri Nouwen writes: "The word patience means the willingness to stay where we are and live the situation out to the full[est] in the belief that something hidden there will manifest itself to us."

Change can be difficult, but change also means to understand why things change in the first place. Change is in of itself not a bad thing. However, being impatient with others can morph itself into a moment of anger directed at an individual for just being in someone's crosshairs. This is a moment in taking the time to understand the situation of the person expressing themselves negatively and then for you to appreciate this person's dissatisfaction for whatever that may be.

Let us take a moment to understand each other. To be patient with one another. And most importantly forgive and pray for each other.
